Albury CBD Walking Tour	Tour is available to download or pick up a hard copy of the tour from the Albury Visitor Information Centre or the Lauren Jackson Sports Centre LambEx registration hub on arrival.	The tour showcases 21 sites spread over 13 locations along Albury's Smollett and Dean Streets. It's the perfect way to experience Albury's beautiful CBD in the context of our rich, pioneering history. Included on the tour are stops at the Albury Railway Station, Botanic Gardens, Beehive Buildings and the former Waterstreet's Hotel. Silver bollards mark the stopping points along the tour, and a brief description of each landmark is provided. When you approach each site, you will be prompted to listen to audio and scroll through a selection of historic photographs.
Albury War Memorial	Memorial Drive, Albury	A drive or walk up Monument Hill to see the Albury & District War Memorial is a must. Opened on Anzac Day 1925, the simple but striking design made of stark white ferro concrete is topped with a 'torch or liberty' and faced with 40 panes of prismatic glass. A wonderful vista across the city centre can also be enjoyed.
Albury LibraryMuseum	Corner Swift and Kiewa Streets, Albury 02 6023 8333	A must for all visitors! View <i>Crossing Place</i> , a permanent exhibition which provides insight into Albury's past. And <i>Sharing Bonegilla Stories</i> which played a significant role in today's society's multiculturalism. Exhibition tours occur the first Sunday of the month at 2.00pm. Free computer internet access is available during opening hours whilst WiFi is available 24 hours surrounding the building.

Huon Hill Parklands	Whytes Road (off the Murray Valley Highway), Wodonga	At 428 metres above sea level, Huon Hill's lookout provides sensational views across the Kiewa Valley, the Victorian alpine region, Lake Hume and the cities of Albury and Wodonga. A number of walking tracks of varying length allow the energetic to explore.
Nail Can Hill	Various access points in West Albury, Grab a map from the Visitor Information Centre for details.	Home to one of the State's most popular fun runs in Australia, the Nail Can Hill Run. Nail Can Hill parklands are located in West Albury and have various access points and walking paths. The parklands feature an abundance of wildflowers in spring, great views and flora secrets such as the critically endangered Spider Orchid.
Wagirra Trail and Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk	Access via the Riverside Parks, Albury	Jump on the Wagirra Trail and Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk and enjoy a leisurely walk along the banks of the Murray River. The Yindyamarra Sculpture Walk shares the stories of local Aboriginal artists and their connection to 'the River', told through the sculptures and interpretive boards.
Lake Hume	Lake Hume, Albury and Wodonga	At six times the size of Sydney Harbour, this is a must on your to do list when in Albury Wodonga. There is a wide variety of public recreation areas and reserves around the lake with access to the lake foreshore and a range of visitor facilities. Fishing, sightseeing and boating are some of the more popular activities available.
Wonga Wetlands	Wonga Wetlands is a five-minute drive from the Albury CBD along the Riverina Highway (the road to Howlong and Corowa). Carpark closes at 4.30pm	Wonga Wetlands, downstream from Albury along the floodplain of the Murray River, is one of the city's must-see destinations. An ecosystem of lagoons and billabongs covering around 80 hectares, Wonga Wetlands is a haven for wildlife and a mecca for birdwatchers, photographers, bushwalkers and families.
